HUD Reporting Updates

LSA Review

Thank you to everyone who helped correct data!

The Chicago CoC has 2 consecutive years with 0 open errors in the LSA.

Areas that needed to be addressed:

- Simultaneous enrollments in projects of the same type, particularly Emergency Shelter and Permanent Housing
- Bed and Unit Inventory Discrepancies
 - Clients being served in projects do not match bed dedication
- Client Household
 - Enrollments where No HOH is identified
 - Enrollments where there are more than 1 HOH
- Clients with unusually long lengths of stay (usually missing an exit date)

2024 Point in Time Count

- PIT was held last Thursday, January 25th. Providers can now review their HMIS PIT Data via the [Sheltered Point in Time 2024 BusinessObjects report](#).
 - Providers should review that all clients being pulled into the report are clients intended to be counted for the PIT.
 - Providers should ensure that Demographic data is complete for all clients.

2024 Housing Inventory Count

The HIC is a one-night inventory count of projects within the CoC that provide beds and units dedicated to serving persons who are homeless. HIC Surveys should reflect the number of beds and units available for occupancy on the night of the PIT count (January 25th).

All surveys must be completed and submitted via Alchemer. PDF submissions will not be accepted

Eva -- HUD Data Accuracy and Completeness Evaluation Tool Introduction and Overview

HUD has released a tool to review and analyze HMIS Data using the hashed CSV export

- File Structure Analysis
- Client Counts
- Project Descriptor Data
- Data Quality – System
- Data Quality – Organization

Eva produces 3 levels of issues:

- High Priority Errors
 - Always indicates a data quality issue that should be fixed. Aim for 0 such errors
 - Affect multiple federal reports
- General Errors
 - Always indicates a data quality issue that should be fixed. Aim for 0 such errors
- Warnings

Data Quality Completion and Logical Issues:

- SSN
- HoH Relationship
- Disabling Condition
- Living Situation
- Length of Stay
- Homelessness Start Date
- Number of Times Homeless

- Destination

Also:

- Project Inventory
- Utilization:
 - Active projects and inventory but no clients served
 - Possibly missing move-in dates
 - Possibly missing exit dates
- Overlapping/Duplicate Enrollments



Welcome to Eva!

Eva is an [open-source](#) project intended for local use by HMIS Administrators in Continuums of Care (CoCs) around the U.S. and its territories. Eva is designed to help you assess the accuracy and completeness of the data within your HMIS. In future iterations it will also assist communities in analyzing HMIS performance data, including coordinated entry, if your community utilizes HMIS for this purpose. Use of this tool is not required by HUD.

Eva is a web-based tool built with R Shiny. This means:

- Eva will only access your CoC's data during your session, **no CoC data is being retained or viewed by anyone besides you**. Eva does retain metadata about the upload file itself, such as the name of your software vendor, your export dates, hash status, and data source information. This is collected for troubleshooting and tool planning purposes.
- You can upload a zipped CSV Export of up to 200 MB. The file must be hashed.
- You can stay up to date with the new features by visiting the Changelog tab.

Agency Participation Agreements (APA)

The CoC requires that Agency Participation Agreements be renewed annually. Each agency using the HMIS must have a current APA executed.

In 2024, we need to ensure that all agencies have been contacted and we have correct contacts and agency information and receive a signed agreement back.

2024 APA Process:

- Email to ATAs and agency heads to verify information
- Send out agreements to sign to each agency via SignRequest
- Follow up with agencies to ensure compliance
- Complete process by 2/16/2024
